Neurodivergent thinkers can struggle to gain employment because of the barriers placed upon them by organisations that do not have the culture to embrace and empower individuals who think and process the world differently. When it comes to autism alone, the Office for National Statistics (ONS) shows that just 22% of autistic adults are employed. Why? Because they struggle to get through the door.

The ideal solution is for organisations to engage in inclusive practices for all – giving a level platform for individuals to show off their strengths and minimise their sensory overwhelm. But how do individuals who are neurodivergent succeed at recruitment when organisations are behind the curve with their own neurodivergent practices?
